**RESPONDENTS' MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE OPPOSITION TO
PETITIONER'S MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION**

Respondents respectfully request an extension of 30 days to respond to Suri's Motion for a Preliminary Injunction. ECF #79. Filed on June 23, 2025, Suri's motion seeks, principally, the reinstatement of Suri's record in the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System ("SEVIS"), as well as his non-party children's SEVIS records. *See* ECF #79-1. Respondents' opposition is currently due July 7, 2025. If granted, a 30-day extension would set Respondents' opposition deadline as August 6, 2025.

Good cause supports this request. On July 3, 2025, Suri's SEVIS records and his children's SEVIS records were reinstated, *nunc pro tunc* to March 18, 2025. *See* ECF #93-1 (screenshots of the reinstated SEVIS database entries). This was the primary relief requested in the Motion for a Preliminary Injunction. *See* ECF #79. As such, Respondents believe an extension would allow the Parties time to consider whether this development narrows the issues that remain to be decided. For this reason, Respondents respectfully request a 30-day extension of their deadline to respond to the Motion for a Preliminary Injunction.

On July 7, 2025, Respondents' counsel contacted Suri's counsel for his position on this request. Notwithstanding that the SEVIS records at issue have been reinstated *nunc pro tunc*, Suri opposes the requested 30-day extension, but would consent to a 7-day extension.

A proposed order is attached for the Court's convenience.
